



APPLICATION GUIDELINES:

Sir John Logan Campbell's Residuary Estate is held in Trust in perpetuity to distribute the income each year as directed by his Will.

Applicants:

Applications will only be accepted from organisations within the "Provincial District of Auckland" which covers approximately that part of New Zealand north of Te Kuiti, Taumarunui, Turangi and the Mahia Peninsula and up to Cape Reinga.

(Please check the map available on the website).

Generally charitable objects of the applicant will fall into the categories of:

- Relief of poverty
- Advancement of education
- Other purposes benefit to the community

The overriding requirement for each of these categories is that the purpose is of "public benefit" and that any grant, in the first instance, directly benefits a sufficiently wide section of the community.

The applicant must be an organisation. In general, an organisation must:

- (a) Be a registered Charitable Trust or a registered Incorporated Society.
- (b) Be controlled by an organisation of persons under an adopted constitution and rules with annually audited accounts and annual reports;
- (c) Be in operation for not less than 12 months.
- (d) Not be run for private profit.
- (e) Not be an individual.
- (f) Neither be a commercial organisation nor operated for commercial purposes.

Applications:

- The annual application period is open from the *1st July to 15th August*.
- The annual allocation of grants is made by the Trustees at a special meeting held in **November** each year.
- Applicants will be advised in writing of the outcome of their application as soon as practical after the November meeting of the Trustees.
- Any capital grants awarded by the Trustees will be retained by the Trust until confirmation is received that the project is fully funded and will proceed.
